
Museum of Newport Irish History formulates plans for significant fund-raising to open a museum

President Arnold recently announced that the Museum was launching a major fund-raising drive for funds to open a museum. The drive will be "launched" in October, at a date yet to be set. Currently, a new brochure is being developed that will outline the Museum's goals and needs for the museum.

The intent will be to raise funds from many sources including foundations, trusts, business and charitable organizations and individuals. The Museum hopes to raise \$100,000 for immediate needs such as computers, furniture, display materials, etc. and an additional \$50,000 for long-term financing.

A formal announcement will be made in late September / early October.

PLAQUE DEDICATION FOR BARNEY STREET/ST. JOSEPH CEMETERY

The bronze plaque was made by the Healy Brothers Foundry of Manville, Rhode Island. All members are urged to drop by and admire and enjoy our new work. This effort basically completes the restoration of the St. Joseph/Barney Street Cemetery although maintenance and up-keep will continue.

The plaque outlines the history of the site and the subsequent building of St. Mary's and St. Joseph's churches. We are planning a more formal dedication of the plaque in the Fall. Watch for the notice.
