
educational - grammar schools, St. Catherine's, De LaSalle

Data: Collective Memory – 19th, 20th & 21st Century

- 19th century use nativity & parentage to define ethnicity: where was person born, where were parents born
- U.S. Census 1980: ask individuals to self-identify their "ancestry"













Fall River Line – Old Colony RR


