HISTORY NOTE: In the late 19th and early part of the 20th century, the Forty Steps on Cliff Walk was a favorite gathering spot for the Irish who lived and worked in Newport. Informal dances were held there on Friday nights. Newport's Irish were recreating a tradition, brought with them from their homeland, which we commemorate each March (weather permitting) during Newport Irish Heritage Month.

This **above turn-of-the-century photo** was *not* taken in Newport, but at Slea Head, a promontory on the westernmost part of the Dingle Peninsula, on the southwest coast of Ireland, and was published under the title "Dancing at Slea Head."
