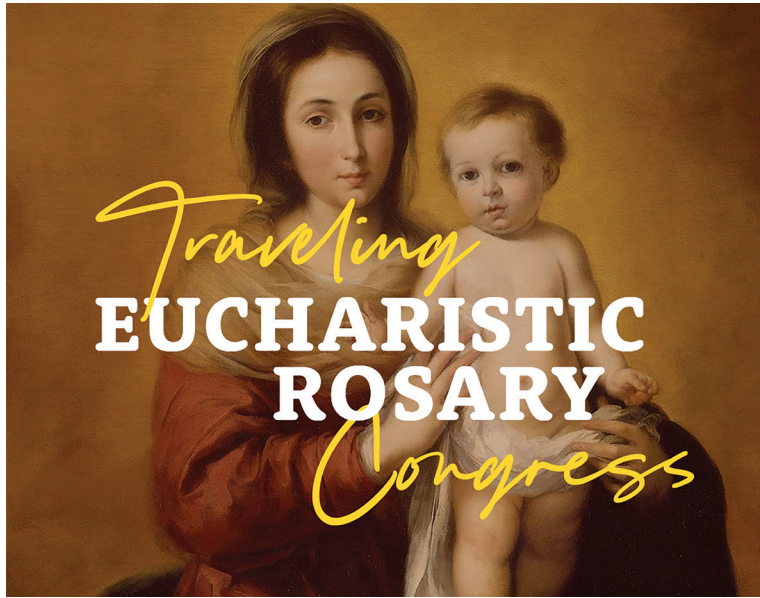


Diocese to take part in Traveling Rosary Congress

Historic Catholic cemetery tours offered this October in Newport

Marino will next lead a tour of historic Saint Joseph Cemetery in Newport (also known as the Barney Street Cemetery), on Sunday, Oct. 8, followed by another tour of St. Mary's Cemetery on Sunday, Oct. 22.

NEWPORT — The public is invited to take a tour of the historic Saint Joseph Cemetery (also known as the Barney Street Cemetery), to be given by the Museum of Newport Irish History on Sunday, Oct. 8 at 1 p.m. Located at the corner of Barney and Mt. Vernon Streets, it is the oldest Catholic cemetery in Rhode Island, and on this site once stood Rhode Island's first Catholic church (1828). Participants will learn about this site, the "birthplace" of the diocese's oldest parish, established in the early 19th century to serve Newport's growing Irish immigrant community.

On Sunday, Oct. 22, at 1 p.m., the museum will offer a tour of the St. Mary's Cemetery, which was

established around the time St. Mary's Church was completed and dedicated (1852). The growing parish, fueled by immigration from Ireland, moved from the Barney and Mt. Vernon location into a much larger, grander edifice. Meet at the Kingston Avenue cemetery gate located near the intersection of Kingston and Warner Street. The tours are free and given by local historian and guide, Steve Marino, weather permitting. Registration is requested.
