

## The Maseam of Newport Irish History MNIH

THE NEXT MUSEUM OF NEWPORT IRISH HISTORY'S MICHAEL F. CROWLEY LECTURE WILL BE HELD ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 9<sup>TH</sup>, 6PM, AT THE LAFORGE CASINO RESTAURANT.

THE SPEAKER WILL BE J. STEVEN GRIMES, DIRECTOR OF ARCHIVES AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT FOR THE RHODE ISLAND SUPREME COURT.

STEVEN HOLDS A B.A. IN HISTORY FROM THE COLLEGE OF THE HOLY CROSS AND A MASTER'S DEGREE IN AMERICAN HISTORY FROM PROVIDENCE COLLEGE. HE HAS CONDUCTED EXTENSIVE RESEARCH ON IRISH NATIONALIST ACTIVITY IN RHODE ISLAND AND ITS CONNECTION TO BROADER NATIONALIST MOVEMENTS IN THE U.S. AND IN IRELAND.

STEVEN GRIME'S TALK IS TITLED "FROM BRICKLAYER TO BRICKLAYER: THE RHODE ISLAND ROOTS OF CONGRESSMAN JOHN E. FOGARTY'S IRISH-AMERICAN NATIONALISM". IN HIS TALK, STEVEN WILL EXAMINE IRISH-AMERICAN NATIONALISM FROM 1945 THROUGH 1967, AND EXPLORE THE ROOTS OF CONGRESSMAN FOGARTY'S NATIONALISM WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THE IRISH WORKING CLASS COMMUNITY IN RHODE ISLAND.

BY THE EARLY 1950'S, IRISH AMERICAN NATIONALISTS HAD CHANNELED MUCH OF THEIR ACTIVITY TOWARD CONGRESSMAN FOGARTY'S EFFORTS TO CONVINCE THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO GO ON RECORD IN SUPPORT OF A UNITED IRELAND.
